

KEEPING YOUR PET SAFE AT

EASTER

Spring is on its way as we celebrate Easter with lots of yummy treats and enjoy nicer weather.

However, it's important to understand this time of year can be dangerous for our pets.



Here's how:



Chocolate

While chocolate is safe for humans to eat, it is poisonous to dogs, as well as most other animals, including cats, rodents and rabbits! So make sure you only share your easter eggs with your human friends.

Chocolate poisoning can cause your pet to be sick, upset stomach, rapid breathing, an increased heart-rate and other symptoms can occur.



Hot cross buns

Grapes, raisins, currants and sultanas are all toxic to dogs so it is very important that hot cross buns are kept well out of reach.







Please tell your parent/guardian if your pet has eaten any of the above foods so they can call the vet and make sure your pet is safe.





Rabbit & Guinea Pig Enrichment










Put veg in a cardboard box or scrunched up newspaper so they have to figure out how to get it out





Pegging or hanging veg off the ground is a great way to get lazy guinea pigs and rabbits exercising



How to make a snuffle mat

May need adult supervision





STEP ONE:

You will need fleece fabric, scissors or rotary cutter, cutting mat, ruler and a draining mat.



STEP TWO:

Cut fabric into strips measuring approx. 9-10 inches long x 1 inch wide. For smaller dogs, can cut smaller at around 6 inches.



STEP THREE:


Thread through the fleece strips and tie an overhand knot on the other side to secure in place, repeat until mat is full.



The back should look something like this.



Follow this pattern shown above, for a more dense



WHY NOT PLAN AN 'EGG' HUNT

FOR YOUR PETS!

REMEMBER! Chocolate is poisonous to dogs, and most other animals including rabbits, so ensure to use a safe alternative to hide.

Dogs

Why not hide your dog's favourite treats around the garden for them to hunt? Or turn it into a game, and hide them under pots for them to sniff and find.









Rabbits

You could use a cardboard box, or a tray, and fill with hay hiding pieces of veggies or treats inside for your buns to find.

Cats

Why not purchase a puzzle feeder to fill with cat treats, and watch your feline friend try to work out how to get them out. It's great for their mental stimulation!





DIY Easter Bunny **Corner Bookmark**

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Square paper (or cut paper into a square, pastel coloured paper works perfectly for Easter)
- White paper (for eyes, teeth)
- Black pen for drawing
- Scissors
- Glue


May need adult supervision





Step 1: Fold the paper diagonally. Unfold.


Step 2: Fold into a triangle. Bring the top of the triangle towards the bottom of the triangle. Fold.



Step 3: Fold the left and right

corner towards the centre of

the triangle.







Step 4: Crease and unfold.

Step 5: Grab the corner again, this time folding it towards the top of the triangle. Crease.



Step 6: Repeat last step on other side.



Step 7: Now tuck tops inside the pocket.



Step 8: You now have a corner bookmark. You can also tuck the triangle inside the pocket.

To turn this corner bookmark into a bunny, you'll need to cut out eyes, ears, teeth and nose/snout and glue them on the bookmark. You can also draw your eyes and add in some whiskers.



Glue the triangle nose on the snout piece and then glue the teeth behind the snout.



You can cut out and glue in an inner ear or colour in.



Glue the ears on the back side of the bookmark.



Place your bunny bookmark on the corner of a page in a book you are reading!





What your bookmark looks like inside a book.



Cat enrichment toy

WHAT YOU NEED:

- 100% cotton fabric (aprrox. 15cm x 15cm) x 2
- Scissors
- Needle and thread
- Dried Valerian Root Herb
- Toy filling (optional)

May need adult supervision





Step 1: Gather materials, mark out squares and cut

Step 2: Pin squares together







Step 3: Sew along the edge


Step 4: Leave a small gap


Step 5: Pull the fabric through the gap so the stitching is now on the inside





Step 6: Using a funnel pour in the herb






Step 7: Sew shut the gap and watch your cat enjoy their new toy!

(Make sure that your cat is supervised whilst using this toy)

TIPS FOR KEEPING ANIMALS SAFE IN

SPRING

Dotty and Daisy says:

It's extremely important not to feed any animal unless you check with the owner first.

You never know what medication, allergies or special diet they need.





Dillon says:

Always keep your dog on the lead in fields where there is livestock. Chances are they will have young this time of year, especially lambs. They may not like me saying hello off my lead!



Twiglet says:

To help keep birds and fledglings safe in their nest, it's useful for me to wear a safety collar with a bell to warn the birds when I'm near.



Charlie and Cola say:

If your rabbit or guinea pig has access to grass, make sure you only allow him small amounts to start with. As eating a lot of grass after eating hay all winter can upset our stomachs.


